

## OVERVIEW OF COURSE EVALUATIONS

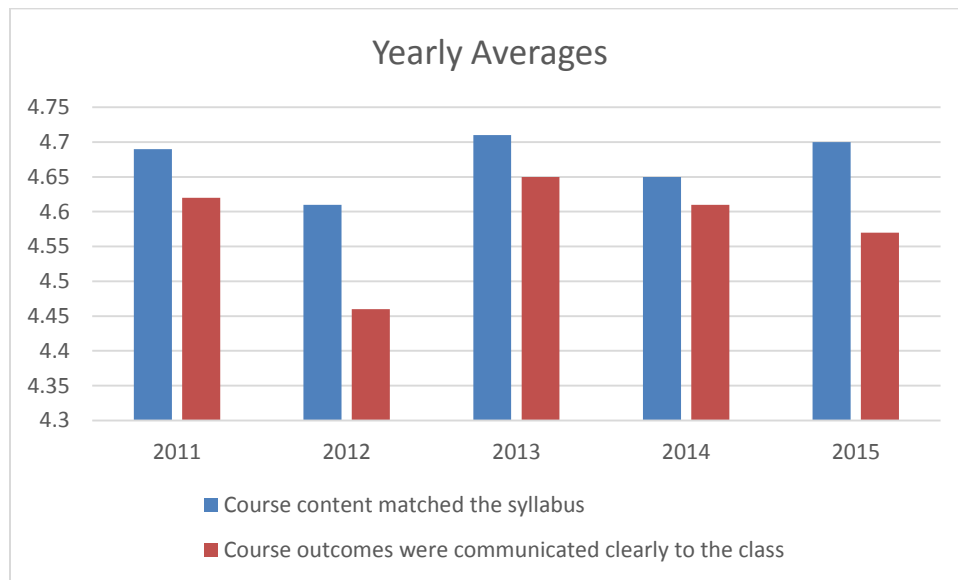

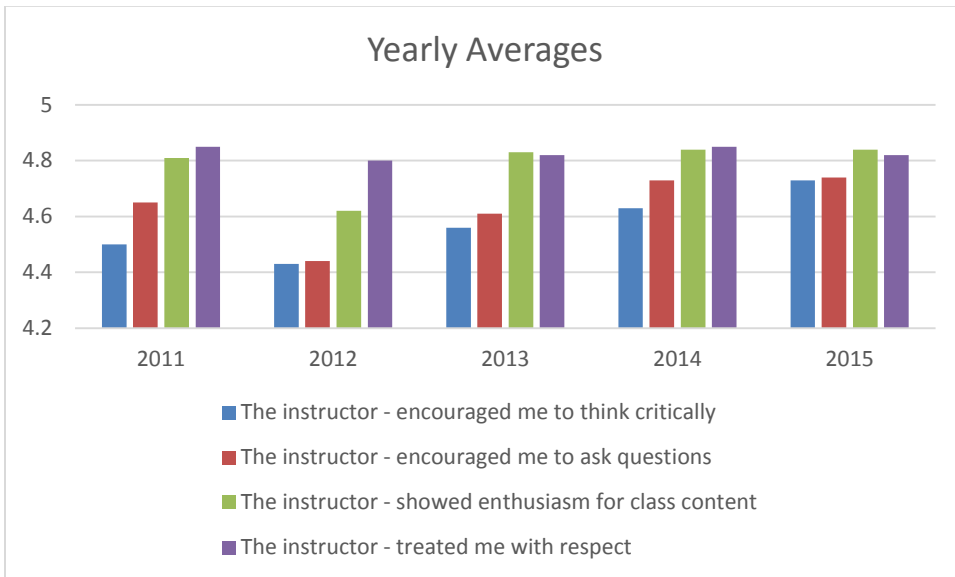
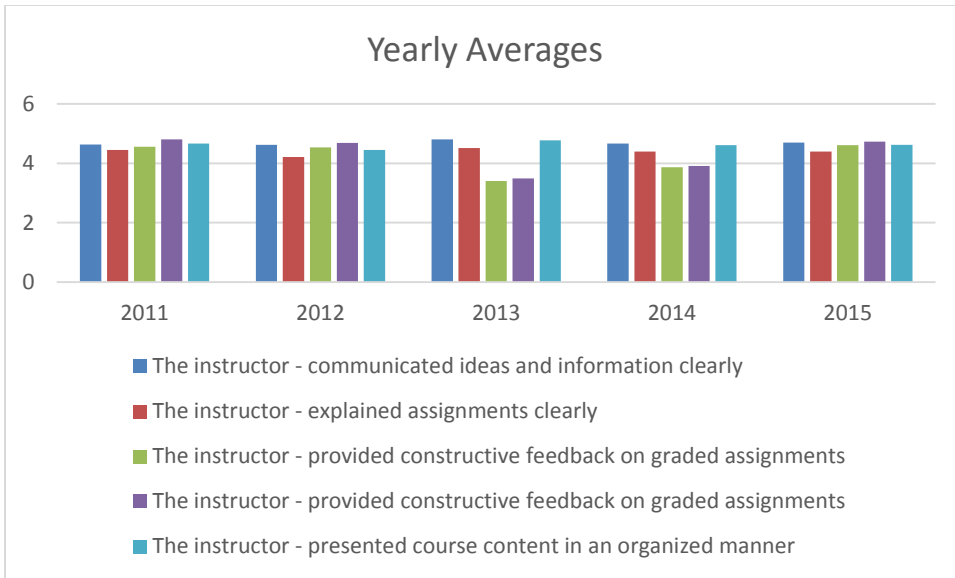

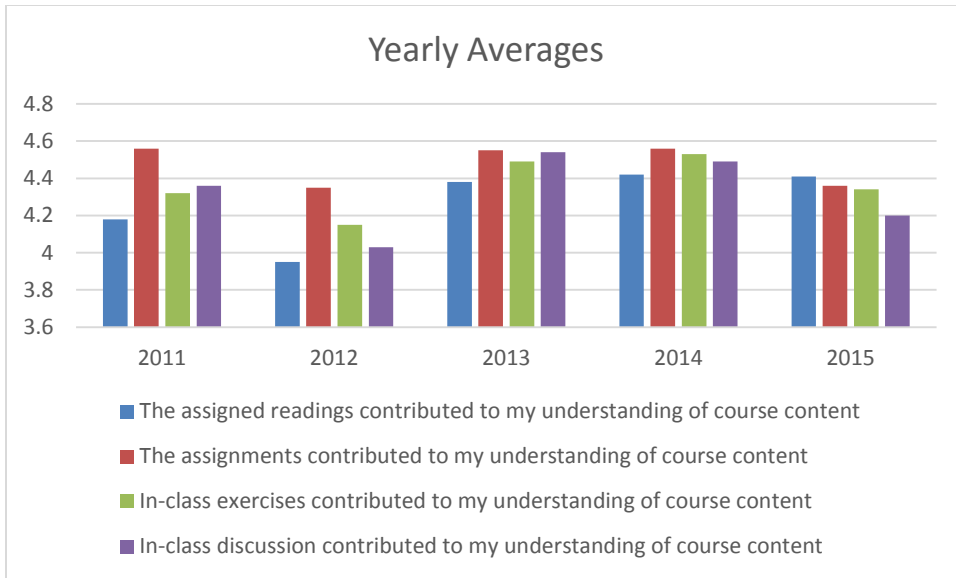

This section shows the average scores by year for selected questions on the course evaluation.

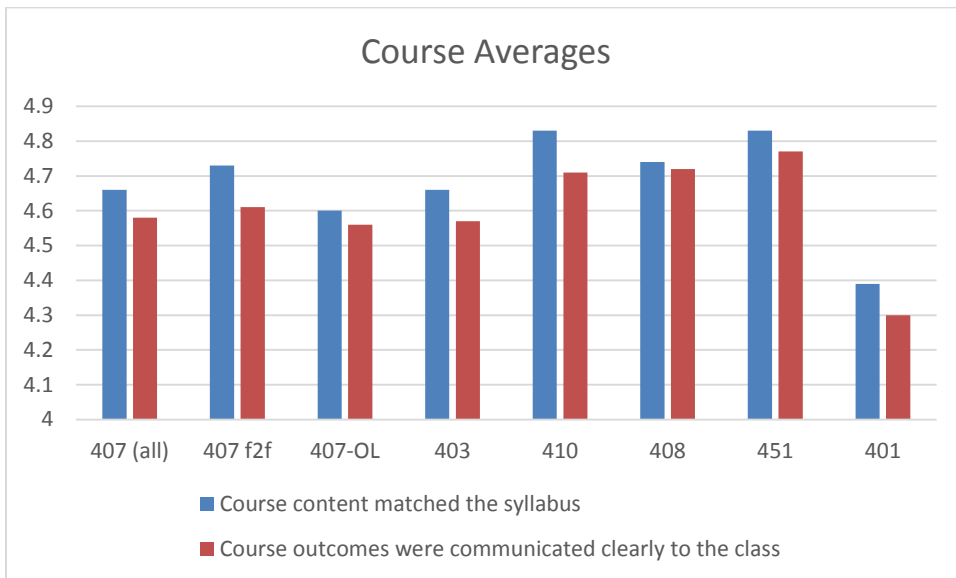


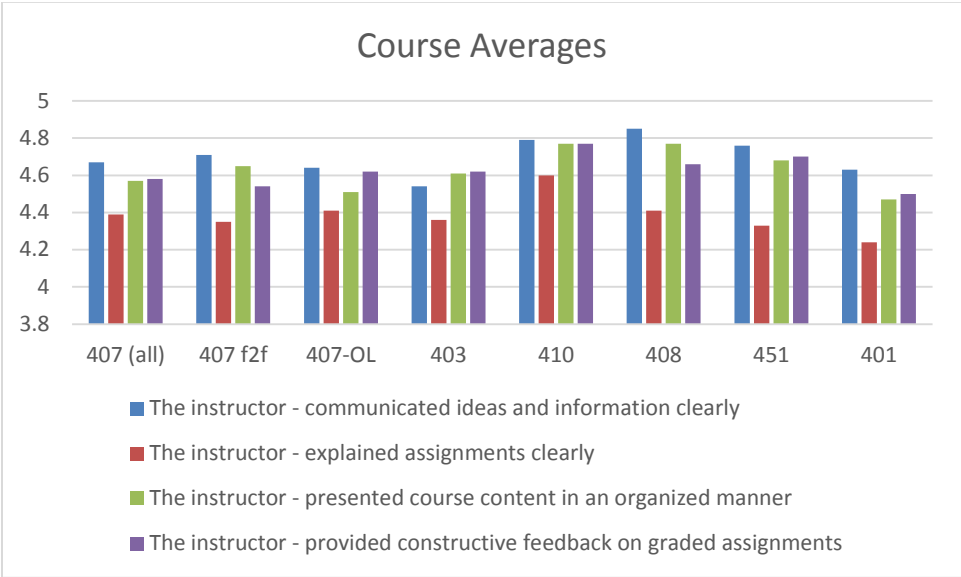
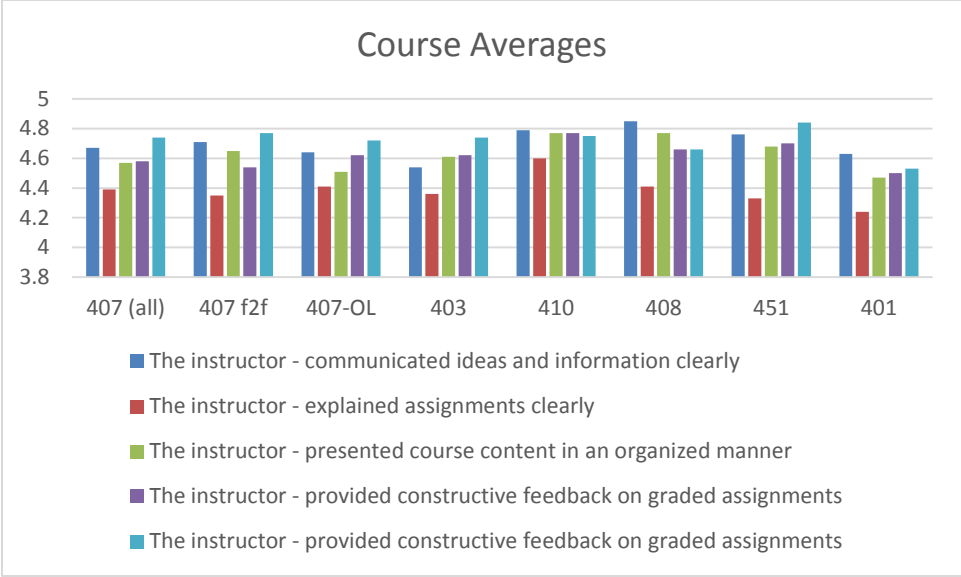


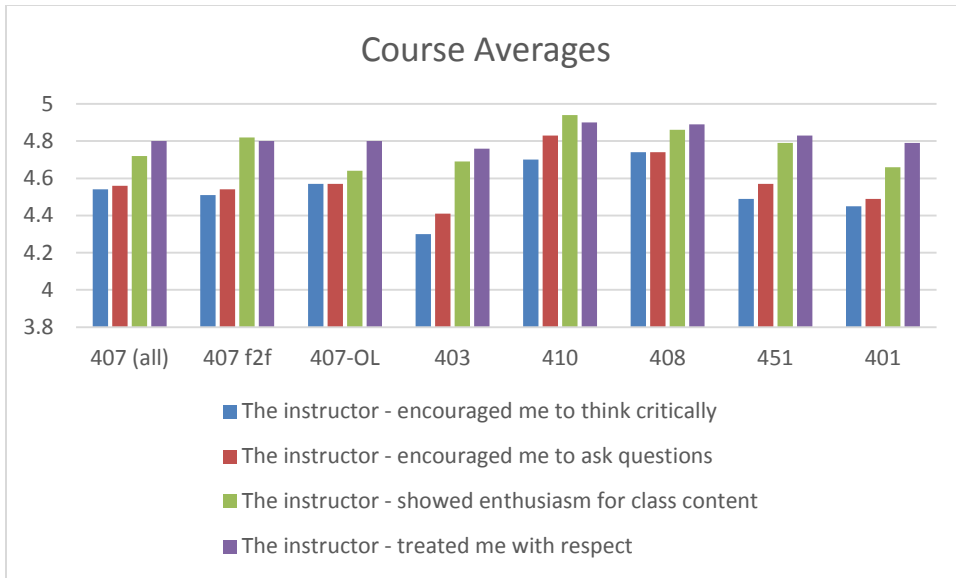


### COURSE AVERAGES

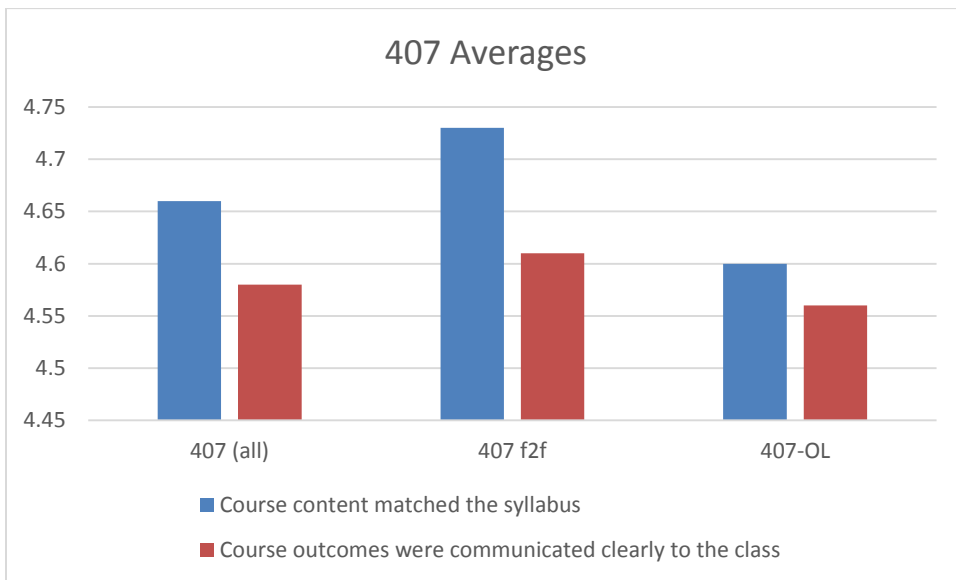


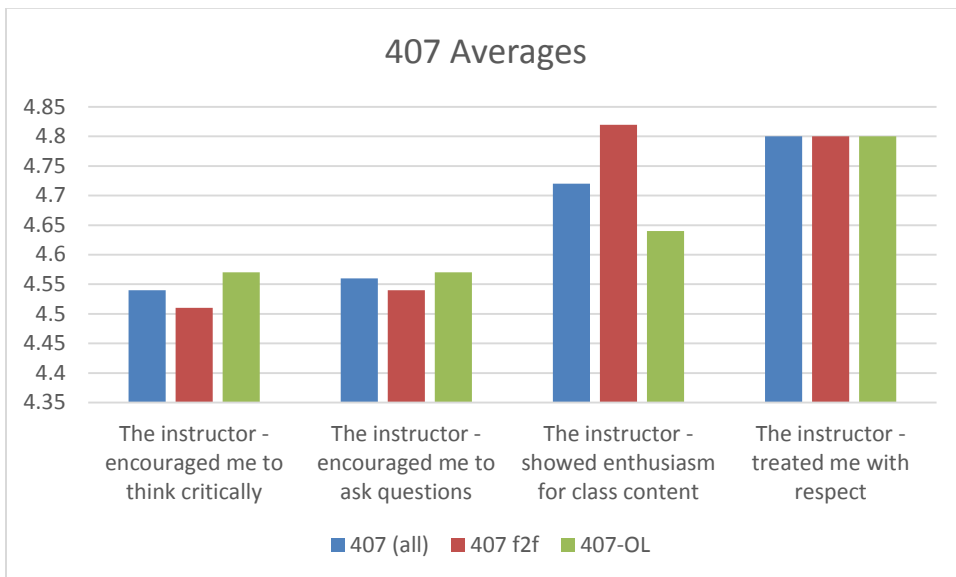
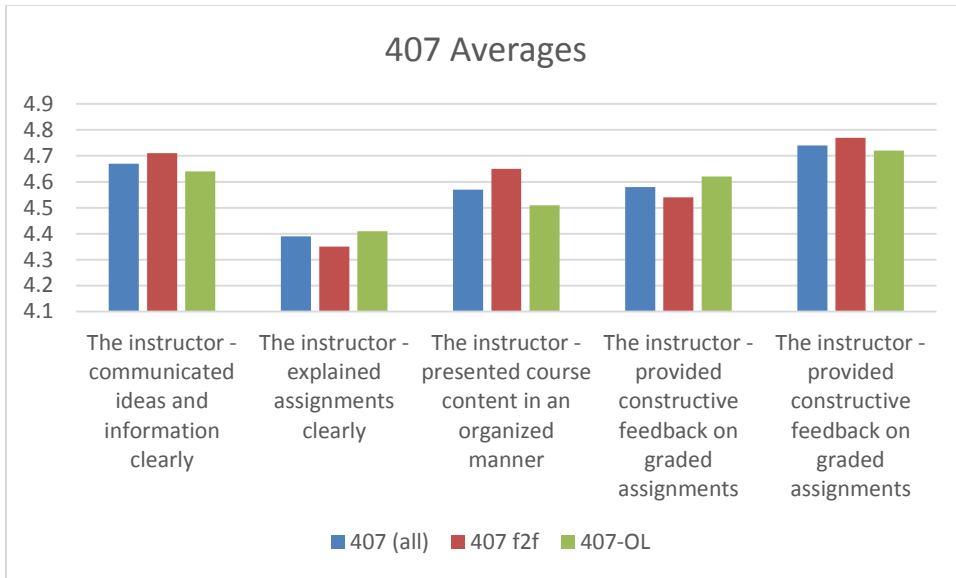




### ONLINE AND F2F COMPARISON

### TABLES OF PERCENTAGES

The following tables show the percentages of students strongly agreeing or agreeing to selected statements from course evaluations. The percentages reflect an aggregate of all classes from 2011 to 2015.

Statement	Percent that strongly agree or agree
<b>The instructor showed enthusiasm for course content</b>	98.4%
<b>The instructor treated me with respect</b>	98.9%
<b>The instructor provided constructive feedback on graded assignments</b>	97%
<b>The instructor encouraged me to think critically</b>	94%
<b>The instructor communicated information and ideas clearly</b>	98%
